8. Environmental Considerations

- If relevant, discuss how the design partner incorporates environmental considerations into their designs.
- Inquire about sustainable materials and practices if important to your project.

9. Budget Alignment

- Ensure the design partner can work within your budget constraints.
- Discuss any potential cost-saving strategies or alternative solutions.

10. Communication & Transparency

- Evaluate their communication style and responsiveness.
- Confirm that they provide regular project updates and are transparent about any issues or challenges.

11. Legal & Contractual Aspects

- Review the contract terms and agreements thoroughly.
- Ensure that all legal and contractual aspects, including timelines, payment schedules, and intellectual property rights, are clearly defined.

12. Awards & Recognitions

- If applicable, inquire about any industry awards or recognition they have received. Recognition can indicate their commitment to excellence.
